

NMO Support Programme Guideline for applications

The IPOPI NMO Support Programme is open to all NMOs and serves as a resource encouraging programmes to enhance diagnosis and treatment, as well as to help new associate NMOs to become effective organisations.

Programme overview

Eligibility:

- Open to associate and full NMOs.

NMO project focus:

- Projects aimed at enhancing diagnosis and optimal treatment and care for people with primary immunodeficiency.
- NMOs are encouraged to explore diverse activities in the national scope.
- Potential initiatives include educational materials, awareness and advocacy campaigns, educational events, and more.
- Exclusion: No grants available for individual needs.

Funding details:

- Maximum grant: €5,000 per project.
- It is understood and appreciated that there are limitations on grants, aligning with the available funds within IPOPI.

Application requirements:

- *Use of form:* Complete the application form [here](#) and send it to IPOPI.
- *Required Information:* Include NMO Chairperson's name, project contact, postal address, contact details, and email address.
- *Project Details:* Outline the project goals, timeline, participants, audience, starting and finishing dates.
- *Budget Statement:* Provide a short budget statement in Euros. Please also state other sources of support for your project (if any), and why IPOPI funding is necessary.
- *Main Contact:* Specify the name and position of the main contact with IPOPI.

Application Review Process:

- Applications are carefully reviewed by the IPOPI Executive Committee.
- Continuous acceptance: Applications are accepted throughout the year.
- Decision timeline: Decisions typically within four to six weeks depending on the project proposal.

Post-Project acceptance:

- IPOPI requires a short report at the project's conclusion.
- If a publication is to be generated as a result of a grant, we require to see a copy of the text, preferably in English. Should the publication be of scientific nature, in the absence of a translation, a signed letter from a known clinical immunologist attesting to the value of the document may be accepted by IPOPI.
- IPOPI should be acknowledged in the project in the most appropriate way.
