IPOPI PIDetect 2023: Enhancing Diagnostic abilities in Moldova

IPOPI's PIDetect programme helps address low diagnosis rate in low- and middle-income countries (LMIC) by providing intensive training to selected doctors from LMIC to improve their skills in recognising and diagnosing PIDs. As part of the 2023 programme two Moldovan clinicians, Dr Cristina Tomacinschii and Dr Rodica Selevestru, were invited for tailored training provided by Prof Mihaela Bataneant and her team in the Romanian PID reference centre of Timisoara at Louis Turcana Children Hospital. Following this fruitful exchange a hybrid conference was organised by Prof Sciuca Svetlana on December 1-2 in Chisinau, Republic of Moldova, to help spread awareness and knowledge on PID more widely throughout the country.

PID diagnostics and care in Moldova

Dr Selevestru and Dr Tomacinschii are affiliated to two different institutes in Chisinau which helped broaden the scope of the PIDetect programme. Both doctors agree that the lack in diagnostic facilities, combined with limited awareness of PID, strongly hampers proper detection and identification of PID and subsequent care. Specialised diagnostic examinations are often not available or, as is the case for genetic analyses, are to be financed by the patient or the patient's family.

Training content and learning environment

During a two-week exchange the clinicians had the opportunity to observe and manage a variety of PID cases, many of which they had never encountered before. They also learned to interpret results from diagnostic techniques and investigations that are not yet regularly applied in Moldova. Both doctors agreed that the training provided was very helpful and that they will benefit from the acquired skills in Moldova. However, integration of the more specialised diagnostic examinations in their home institutions will depend on the availability of additional resources.

The conference was well attended and various topics were covered including PID classification, screening methods, diagnostic procedures and treatment approaches. The lectures were organised to address a wide range of medical professionals. The second day of the conference focused

on the patient experience and stimulated enriching discussions between clinicians and PID patients.
