Basic tips for mobile videography

BEGINNER

→ SHOOTING VIDEOS WITH YOUR PHONE IS EASY AND FUN! WITH A FEW KEY TIPS, YOU CAN CREATE HIGH-QUALITY. ENGAGING FOOTAGE THAT TELLS YOUR STORY EFFECTIVELY.

OBJECTIVES:

- Improve video quality: Simple tips for capturing professional-looking videos.
- Encourage creativity: Experiment with angles, lighting, and editing.
- Make it easy: Beginner-friendly steps using just a smartphone.

ADVANTAGES:

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CAMERA ANGLES & STABILISATION

Hold your phone with both hands to **prevent shaky footage**. Use a tripod or steady surface for smoother shots.

Try different angles—above, below, or sideways—for a more dynamic look, instead of just eye level.

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LIGHTING

Natural light is your best friend, so film near a window when indoors.

Avoid harsh overhead lighting and light behind your subject.

FOCUS AND EXPOSURE

Tap on the screen to **set focus and adjust exposure** manually.

Lock the focus if your subject is moving.



RESOLUTION AND FRAME RATE

Record in the highest resolution available (usually HD or 4K) and

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Record in the highest resolution available (usually HD or 4K) and choose a frame rate that fits your subject—24fps for a cinematic look or 60fps for smoother motion.

USE MANUAL SETTINGS

If your camera app allows, adjust settings like ISO, shutter speed, and white balance for more control over the look of your video.





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PLAN YOUR SHOTS

Sketch out your video or make a quick list of the scenes you want to capture.

Think about the beginning, middle, and end of your video to help the story flow.

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EXPERIMENT

Don't be afraid to try different angles, perspectives, and movements.

Low angles or overhead shots can add interest to your footage.

EDITING

Use mobile editing apps to enhance your footage.

Cut out unnecessary parts, add music, and apply filters or color grading to give your video a polished look.

GET CREATIVE

Break the rules and get confident that you can create engaging and professional-looking videos with just your mobile device!
